Getting back to the “real world” isn’t easy. Many of us had never been sober on the outside. At first it was a little frightening to reach out to sober strangers and ask for help. As ex-problem drinkers, we know from experience that the most unstable part of our journey was between leaving treatment centers or institutions and arriving at the doors of an Alcoholics Anonymous meeting.

Bridging the Gap offers a temporary contact person, which is a sober member of AA who volunteers to contact you. They can help you get to several meetings, introduce you to people active in the program and answer any questions you may have about the program. Mainly they will help you get acquainted with AA in your area.
